 After reassuring the Corinthians of God's help when facing temptation, Paul exhorts them "flee from idolatry" (1 Corinthians 10:13-14). What is the definition of flee? Discuss your challenges and what you do to flee from idolatry 	

2. The word participation is mentioned twice in 1 Corinthians 10:16. Explain what you think is significant about this participation and what it looks like according to 1 Corinthians 1:9, 10:16; Philippians 1:3-5, 2:1-2, 3:10.

3. "Because there is one loaf, our many-ness becomes one-ness---Christ doesn't become fragmented in us. Rather we become unified in Him. We don't reduce Christ to what we are; He raises us to what He is." (1 Corinthians 10:17 from The Message).
