1 Chronicles 29:1-19 (6/22/2025)

SERMON DISCUSSION: How were you impacted by the sermon? What new thoughts or lessons did you discover? In what ways did you find yourself challenged and/or encouraged?

READ 1 Chronicles 29:1-19

1. David begins by addressing a concern that (it seems) everyone is worrying about—the fact that when David dies, his son, Solomon (who is the heir to the throne) seems woefully prepared to lead Israel effectively.

Have you ever been in a situation where you felt "under-prepared" and people were looking to you for leadership... OR have you ever been in a position where you were being asked to follow someone else, that you felt was "under-prepared"? (Share)

2. As you read Verse 1, what seems to be David's "solution" to this concern? How is David challenging us to think differently about God and our circumstances?

3. In Verse 2, David lists all of the "materials" that he is providing for the building of the Temple (Palace for God). Then, in Verse 3, he talks about a second list of materials that he is also providing.

Talk about the difference between these two (2) "offerings"... How does David characterize this second gift, and what does this tell us about this gift and what is going on in David's heart?

4.	Look, again, at Verses 10-13 What stands out to you from this Prayer, and what perspective about the Lord do you glean from David's perspective?
5.	Look at Verses 14-16 What do you see and appreciate from David's words, here?
6.	What do you think about the following statement? You can give generously of your treasures without giving yourself but you cannot give yourself without also giving your treasure.
7.	What does it mean, for you, to "consecrate yourself to the Lord"?
